



## Outstanding School Health Researcher Award

### Description

The purpose of this award is to recognize an ASHA member who has demonstrated sustained and outstanding contributions to school health research.

### Award Criteria

- Nominee demonstrates the significance and quality of their research agenda contributing to the school health field in addition to translational research aligned with the Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child (WSCC) model, ASHA's mission, and position papers.
- Nominee demonstrates ability to acquire funding (internal and/or external) contributing to school health research and ASHA's mission.
- Nominee demonstrates high-quality empirical school health research aligned with ASHA's mission and published in peer-reviewed, indexed journals.
- Nominee demonstrates valuable contribution to school health research by presenting at national and/or international conferences. Additionally, the nominee has presented at the ASHA conference three out of the past five years, being first author on one or more presentations.
- Nominee is a current member of ASHA.

### Nominee Packet

When submitting a nomination, please include the following:

- Two letters of support, one of which must be from the nominator who is a current ASHA member. Both letters should contain information highlighting the nominee's expertise, as well as his/her impact in the school health research.
- A current resume or curriculum vitae from the nominee highlighted to display how the nominee addresses award criteria.

The nominee packet must be submitted by 5:00pm Eastern Standard Time on the deadline date.

**Note:** Documentation of highly ranked nominees is reviewed by the Leadership and Recognition Committee for up to three years. Candidates will be notified of subsequent reviews and will have the opportunity to accept or withdraw from consideration. Nomination packets must be updated yearly for continued consideration.
