

Mission, Purpose, and History

The mission of the American School Health Association (ASHA) is to transform all schools into places where every student learns and thrives.

ASHA envisions healthy students who learn and achieve in safe and healthy environments nurtured by caring adults functioning within coordinated school and community support systems. The Association is a multidisciplinary organization of administrators, counselors, dietitians, nutritionists, health educators, physical educators, psychologists, school health coordinators, school nurses, school physicians, and social workers.

For nearly 100 years, ASHA has advocated for quality school health programs for every child. ASHA proudly serves as the only multidisciplinary national membership organization supporting a coordinated and collaborative approach to school health. ASHA was founded at the annual meeting of the American Public Health Association (APHA) on October 27, 1927. Known then as the American Association of School Physicians, the new organization's first president was William A. Howe, MD. Interest in the association grew so rapidly that in 1936, it opened its membership to all professionals interested in promoting school health, and the organization officially became the American School Health Association.

President's Message

We have experienced significant change and transition over the past several years, and we have learned a great deal. We have listened extensively, made adjustments, and utilized data to inform our decisions. ASHA is in a solid financial position and has built reserves to ensure its stability into the future. The bylaws have been updated to extend the terms of the Board of Directors to 3 years and to create a role for the Past President, which will bring more consistency under changes in leadership. Beginning in January 2025, I will transition to this new role and am excited to stay involved and support the new team of officers.

The 2025 board, under the leadership of Dave Kobel, will oversee the management of ASHA's healthy reserve funds and continue investing in socially responsible funds. We'll be kicking off our 100th year celebration at our 2025 conference in Denver, Colorado. We'll begin the festivities there, culminating in our 100th anniversary in 2026.

Thank you to Sarah Blanton, Sarah Helton, and Chris Paske for their years of service to ASHA and the BOD. Sarah and Chris will continue leading FLA, and we are immensely grateful for their service. In the past few years, we have seen an increase in FLA applications, which is a true testament to their mentorship and commitment to the program.

We've negotiated a 5-year contract renewal with Wiley for the publication of the Journal of School Health. This includes some terrific concessions that will benefit ASHA moving forward. JOSH continues to be considered a top-tier journal with a 2023 Clarivate impact factor of 1.8.

Through the transition from subscription to open access, JOSH revenues have exceeded estimates once again. Josh Editor and Managing Editor, Dr. Michael Long, and Ashley Havlicak are working with our Research and Publications Committee to recruit new reviewers to decrease the submission-to-acceptance time.

ASHA has weathered the disruptions of the pandemic and offered more virtual and ondemand options. We've now held three inperson conferences and continue to offer professional development opportunities. Thank you for all you do for students and the field of school health.



Executive Director's Message

Since entering into a partnership with Indiana University, the staff have overseen growth in key areas including convenings, dissemination, and stewardship. ASHA is renowned for convening a multidisciplinary audience, offering both virtual and in-person events. ASHA continued the tradition of disseminating cutting-edge research through our Journal of School Health (JOSH) and providing up-to-date knowledge and skills through our high-quality professional development. ASHA continues to be a good steward of its resources, including funding, relationships, and members, to shepherd ASHA into the next 100 years. The Board of Directors has initiated an investment strategy that includes sustainability and socially responsible investing. Overall, ASHA has adapted to changing trends and times and is committed to sustaining the Association by keeping students at the center. Goals for 2024 included renewing the external agency agreement with IU, seeking additional grant funding, expanding the staff, and increasing engagement in DEIA and sustainability efforts, including growing the membership.

ASHA negotiated a 4-year renewal of the Indiana University external agency agreement, which leverages the University's human resources for management of ASHA. Part of this agreement includes hiring a part-time staff person to help create more ASHA-branded content. This is the first step in growing our staff capacity. To that end, ASHA applied for three grants in 2024. Though we were not funded, we have further developed relationships with funders and expressed our interest in new initiatives. Now we have ideas on the page and feedback from funders that will help us improve.
